Academic Half Day Cases - Inadequately Explained Injury

Clinical Presentations: Inadequately Explained Injury (Child Abuse)

- 1. This 2 year old child was brought in by her mother to see you because she has noticed a lot of bruising on the child since picking her up from daycare this afternoon. When the mother asked the daycare what happened they couldn't explain how she got the bruises.
- 2. This 5 week old's mother brought him in because she noticed his right leg was swollen yesterday and it is not getting better. He seems to be in a lot of pain. An x-ray shows a fracture of the right femur. The mother is not sure how it happened but she has a 3 year old as well and thinks maybe he did something to the baby.
- 3. This 14 month old was brought in to the emergency department after sustaining a burn to her face and chest. Her mother says she spilt hot tea on her.
- 4. This 5 year old told her aunt that her mother's boyfriend put his pee pee inside her a few weeks ago. The aunt isn't sure whether to believe her and brings her to your clinic. You think her hymen looks normal on physical exam.
